### FINGERPLAY: UP IN THE APPLE TREE

#### **Say This:**

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### **COOKING: JOHNNY APPLESEED SPREAD**

1. Prepare toast.
2. While toast is still warm, help your child spread peanut butter thinly over bread.
3. Spoon a tablespoon of applesauce in center of each slice.
4. Sprinkle cinnamon and sesame seeds on top.

### **COOKING: EDIBLE WORMS**

1. Make Peanut Butter Dough: Mix two cups dry powdered milk, two cups creamy peanut butter, half cup honey in mixing bowl.
2. When dough has reached smooth consistency, give your child a small ball to transform into a worm.
3. Make other shapes, and practice your counting by adding them all up when you are finished.



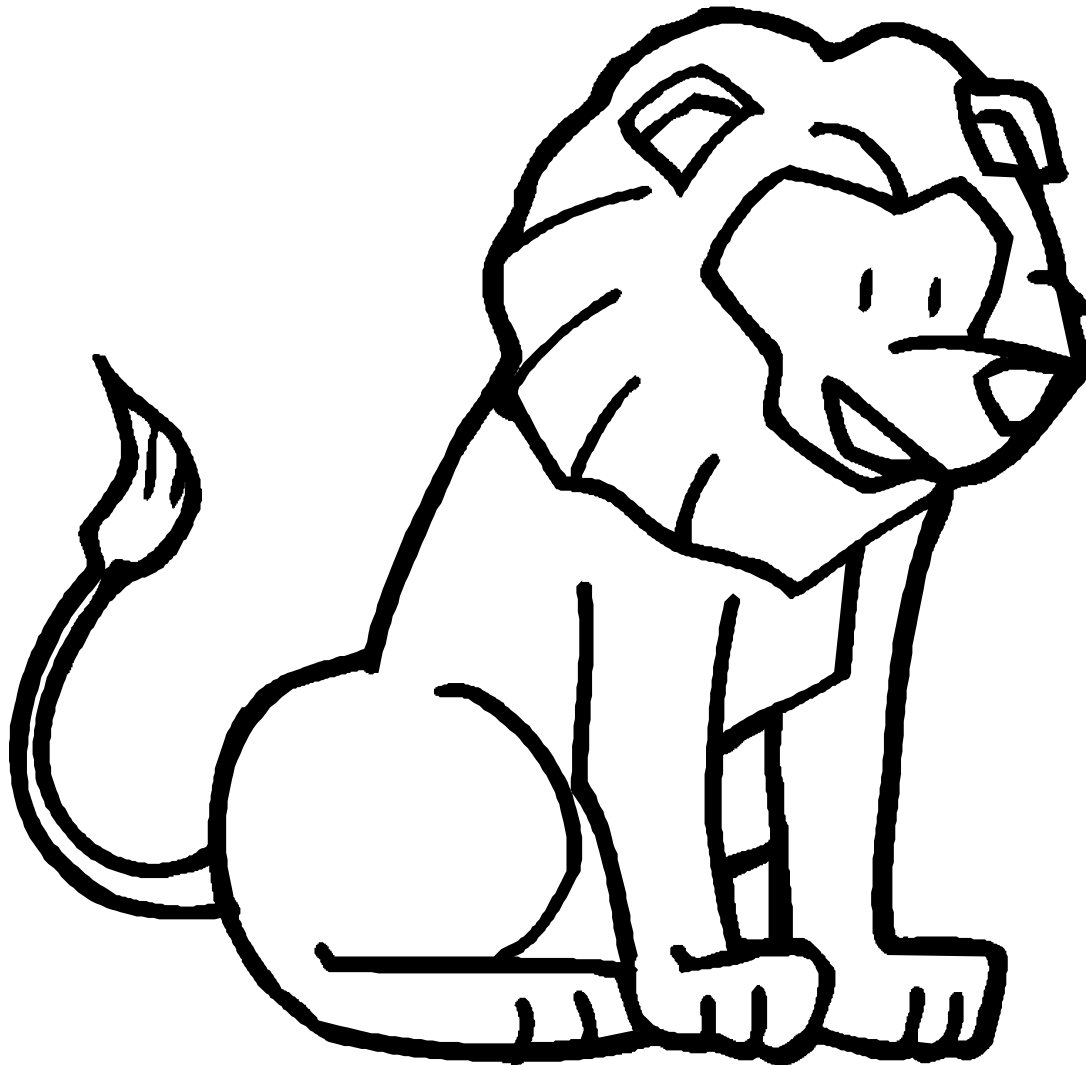
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### CRAFT: TEN APPLES UP ON TOP (PATTERN #1)
